## Introduction (ごあいさつ)

Toyonaka International Friendship Association (TIFA) was founded in 1985 in Toyonaka City, Osaka Prefecture, with the aim of promoting international exchange in the neighborhood. In 2000, 15 years after our establishment, TIFA became a non-profit organization with the aim of furthering multicultural understanding and coexistence. We promote activities rooted in the community involving handmade crafts and overseas activities in order to realize a peaceful society where it is easy for all of us to live together. Anyone with an interest in the diverse cultures of the world is welcome to join us. We look forward to your participation in the local and global activities of TIFA.

## Progress of TIFA (TIFA のあゆみ)

1985 Founded by volunteers who had completed the course "International Exchange in the familiar environment", starts to promote exchange activities and provide livelihood support to foreign residents of Japan

1992 Formed "Toyonaka Citizens' Network for International Exchange"

1995 Activities to support independence of women in rural Nepal start

1999 An orphanage for girls in Nepal opened

2000 An office in Kitasakurazuka, Toyonaka City opened

2000 Recognized as a non-profit organization from Osaka Prefecture

2005 "Asia Youth Forum" to commemorate 20th anniversary held

2006 Certificate of Appreciation from the Mayor of Toyonaka City and the Governor of Osaka Prefecture

2007 International Children's Camp starts

2012 January-Office relocated to Honmachi, Toyonaka City

2012 March-"Cafe Sapana" opened, starts to support its operation

2014 Receives "Free City Sakai Peace Contribution Award"

2015 30th anniversary event held

2021 February-Office and Cafe Sapana relocated and newly opened

As of January 2022, 86 regular members, 7 directors, 1 supervisor



## Support for Foreign Residents (在住外国人支援)

We provide daily support for everyone to be able to live safely in the community.

If you have any problems or concerns about life in Japan, or if you need help...please feel free to talk to us

We have international exchange rooted in the community, which is the core of TIFA's activities, and training programs accepting participants from overseas.

A program for international students and other family members to enjoy international exchange on a daily basis.

#### Foreign Language Classes (外国語講座)

Classes for international exchange such as English classes are offered by volunteers.

#### World Cooking Class 世界の料理教室

Learn how to cook cultural home-cooking dishes from foreigners living in the community and hear about diverse food cultures.

#### TIFA International Children's Camp (TIFA 国際子どもキャンプ)

Camps are held once a year with foreign instructors from various countries in order to deepen international understanding. (for students in 4th year of elementary~3rd year of middle school)

TIFA holds lectures to help participants learn about world trends and gain a global perspective.
